Passion (Palm) Sunday... Today, on Palm Sunday, Jesus makes public the announcement that he is the true Messiah, the Anointed one. During Jesus' time people considered the palm tree a princely tree and its branches symbols of victory and well-being. So the people throw palm branches in front of Jesus to proclaim his anointed leadership. And yet Jesus rides on a donkey as peaceful people did, not on a warhorse like the generals of that time. How many times have we hoped for a more powerful messiah, one who would change our lives for us? How many times have we moved from pardon and nonviolence to anger and revenge? Today, like Jesus, let us process in peace and forgiveness. Let us seek the kingdom of Jesus, the true Messiah.
